COMMITTEE REPORTS

Fish Committee presented by Jim Corcoran

- Fish-a-palooza was a success. It was held on 2/2/2020 and there were 161 registered anglers. There were 20 anglers above the 2019 total. The largest northern pike caught was 37 1/2". The largest walleye caught was 19 1/2" and the largest bass caught was 18". All fish were very healthy.
- The 2020 Annual Kids Fish Jamboree will be held on 7/18/2020. Plans are in the works.
- Jeff Angst mentioned that there are plans to have horses at the event for the kids.
- Jim is scheduled to participate in a fishing program for children at the Elkhorn Library on June 20th.
- Jim Corcoran would like to plan a cleanup date for the parking area at The Landing where the fish cribs are built. A date for this event is in the works.

Water Quality presented by David DeAngelis

To date, Middle and Mill Lakes have ice cover for 80 days. Green Lake has had ice cover for 75 days. There was a two-week stretch from the end of December until mid January where all three lakes opened up due to unseasonably warm temperatures. All froze over the 3rd week of January. Water quality testing will resume in late March or early April depending on when the lakes open up and weather allows for safe boating.

Website Donations

- I am pleased to announce that the ability to accept credit card donations via the <u>LLIA.org</u> website has launched! A big thank you to Treasurer Herb Sharpless for helping to review and connect the financial side. Also, a thank you to those who processed test transactions and provided feedback.
- Donors can direct donations to specified options that currently include: Winter Fish-a-palooza, Kids Fishing Jamboree, Fish Stocking Fund, Lake Preservation Fund, and the General Fund. Donations can also be made in Honor or Memory of, with a space available to capture details.
- Two donations were accepted online for the Winter Fish-a-palooza. (Thanks Corky for being the first!)
- Transaction security and encryption is built-in through standard functionality from the web hosting and credit card processing companies. The credit card processing company does take approximately 3% of each donation in transaction fees (so encourage donors to round up). Payment methods accepted are:

Town Of LaGrange

- Aerators ALL need a permit annually
 - o several were noted in one area that created dangerous area of open water
 - o with 1 exception, only aerators permitted in wet boathouses
 - o more people want to protect permanent piers
 - Town denied (other than one for wet boathouse) & will ask Lake District to provide guidance
- Structure in environmentally sensitive areas technically no new or replacements allowed
 - o adding shore stations (free standing & adding to existing pier slips)
 - replacing piers (technically not allowed, but Town approving IF same location/footprint)
- Wharf permit request was denied ... even with DNR permit being issued.

Lake Management District - 2 meetings

- Approved resolution to engage in a Water Shed Study
 - o needed to apply for DNR grant
 - o engaging a consultant to assist
 - o will involve volunteers & gain input from lake community
 - o about 3 year process
- Dam completed
 - o submitted materials for significant reimbursement from DNR
 - developing Slow No Wake policy
- Club House / Golf Course
 - o doing detailed analysis of golf course operations
 - increase rounds
 - improve revenue / round recognizing don't want to drive away local use
 - recently received rough estimate of repair vs replace on current footprint
 - begin to discuss in community
 - go to Lake District meetings....sign up on line for notices
 - will continue to focus on repairs & maintenance to keep property safe ...\$\$ budgeted
- Hwy 12 ... Jack established contacts in SEWRPC to stay updated
 - o write our local senator and rep on observed issues (contact in Directory)
- Internet ... Jack made contact with alternate provider who is assessing demand, and will cover in ShoreLines
- Loud music discussed ... Peg Eggert pursuing; education is first step article in *ShoreLines* (Wake Responsibly program)
- Lake District office hours (similar to Town) ... Thursday morning (Kristy) at Community Center bldg.

Kettle Moraine Land Trust presented by David DeAngelis

We've been busy doing a lot of burning (burn piles) in most of our preserves.

- BOARD MEMBERS We are still looking to add board members. We would like a volunteer from LLIA to represent the interests of LLIA on the board.
- There is a KMLT event this evening from 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm at the Geneva Lake Museum, 225 Mill Street in Lake Geneva. There will be a featured speaker - Dr. Richard Beifuss and he will be talking about CRANES - AMBASSADORS for CONSERVATION. The event will start with refreshments and hors d'oeuvres. Tickets are \$15 at the door.
- We are planning on expanding the Peterson Island Woods trail to extend along the
 preserve just inside the Oak Park Road perimeter. We are looking for volunteers and
 donations to help clear downed trees, remove invasive and mulch the trail. There likely
